

For Pets of the Homeless Veterinary Care

Grant ideas to be performed where the homeless congregate

- Perform a vaccination clinic for pets of the homeless
- Perform wellness physicals for pets of the homeless and administer minor or major medical treatment.
- Perform spay and neuter surgeries to pets of the homeless.

Places where the homeless congregate include: campgrounds, under freeway bridges, by rivers, in city parks, at and around homeless shelters, food banks and soup kitchens. You should identify a location and a schedule before you apply. Please take a few minutes to read about VetSOS in San Francisco, it is working wonderfully and we feel it is a representation of what we would like to see in cities across the country. <http://www.vetsos.org>

Grant Eligibility

- A exempt organization with a 501 (c)(3) status in its own name

OR;

An instrumentality of a state or local government as provided by Section 170 (c)(1) of the Code

OR;

- A licensed veterinarian in the state in which services will be rendered.

Application Process

- Please complete the application and include a detailed proposal including goals, objectives and projected costs.
- Once the application and proposal is received, it will be reviewed by the Governing Board of Feeding Pets of the Homeless for verification of a current license.
- Each project approved by the Board will receive written notice with funding included.
- A final report is due 120 days when the funds have been expended and the project, as proposed in the application has been completed. The final report should include detailed invoices with costs of medicines and vaccines and also include photos (with photo releases of persons in the photo) of the event. The organization recognizes that some projects, despite being well conceived and executed, will not achieve the desired results. Information about approaches that have not succeeded is also important and valuable to the organization. Reporting successes or not successful projects will not disqualify you from applying in the future.
- The grant is subject to audit and any evidence of violation, misrepresentation in the terms of this grant, or conflict of interest will result in loss of grant and/or repayment of funds to Feeding Pets of the Homeless.

Grant amounts are \$500 or more. Applicants can apply once every 12 months.
