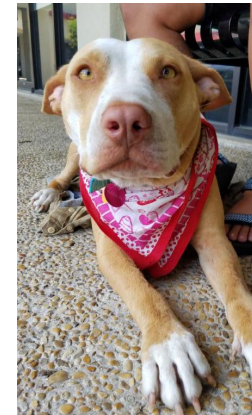

Pets of the Homeless received a call from a homeless woman, who was currently living in the Austin, Texas area. The woman lives in her car with her 2-year-old spayed female Pit Bull Terrier, Blossom, who is her service dog. After interviewing her we found out that she has been homeless since she was 11 years old due to an abusive cycle as a child. She told us she had become a traveler at a very young age and now she travels around with her companion, Blossom. The homeless woman said Blossom had symptoms of heart worm, which are a mild persistent cough, fatigue after moderate activity, decreased appetite, and weight loss. Blossom also had discharge coming out of one of her right mammary glands. We approved an exam with a network veterinarian.

After the exam, the doctor informed us that Blossom tested positive for heart worm and mastitis. Mastitis is an infection of the mammary gland; it is when the mammary gland becomes swollen and is very painful for the dog. The doctor recommended and we approved blood work and medications including enough

antibiotics to treat the heart worm for six months.
